







1. Facility Ideas (52/31%)

- O Add Meeting/Work Rooms/Space (8): Definitely, more workspaces where people can telecommute and have conference calls. | Have you considered offering soundproof Pods so people could work and have the occasional conference call from the library? | | I would really appreciate a space where I can go to work on occasion. It's tough when a meeting is on my work schedule, and there isn't a place to conduct the meeting in a private space where one can talk anywhere in the building. | I t would be nice if there was more space for programs and meetings. I know you share the big room with the senior center, but you don't really have other big rooms or even small group rooms for smaller things. | Maybe provide private rooms so people can do Zoom meetings with work or interviews | More working space and private rooms | Need rooms for meetings/phone calls, etc. | Would be nice if the library meeting room was also available as a meeting space for local town groups not affiliated with the library
- o **Improve Parking (7):** Better parking! || Dedicated parking spots close to the entry for families with young children would be great! || I know you touched on parking but I parking is a very big problem for those who don't want to park on the street. || Improved parking would be great walking with little kids can be a pain, and there seems to be a fair amount of free, usable space close to the building. || More parking spaces || The parking is definitely essential as is the ability to access the building so those young and old of all abilities and needs can access the library. || Wish there was more parking available
- Enhance/Expand Children's Room (6): Although I don't live here anymore when my grandchildren were younger, I took them here a lot. A separate room for storytime would be great. I found too many distractions in the large area || Better children's area. || I wonder if the steps in the children's area can be remodeled to include storage underneath, freeing up some space for more accessible seating and/or an open area for the sensory play the library has been incorporating recently. I notice lots of grandparents bring their children to the library and there's only one couch to sit on to read stories to their children now that the new 3-sided structure has been brought in. - o **Enhance/Expand Children's Room (6) (cont.):** More separation between adult/children's rooms. Kids with disabilities don't have to worry about being too loud. || More space in the children's room. || We go to Foxborough as the children's center is new and has fun toys. We would love to go to Mansfield Library, but the children's area needs work.
- o Improve/Enlarge Tweens/Teen Space (5): Anticipating middle school and high school, it will be important for our children to have a place to study with friends or work on projects in a quiet focus area. || If there was more for my teen to do, a solid place for studying, etc.. where my 4- & 7-year-old could also be engaged without getting into too many things, it would be easier for us to come hang out and do more with our town's library. || Increase the tween/teen spaces. The tween/teen spaces serve a great community need. My kids feel safe and comfortable there || It would be great to have a teen area like Ames Free Library in Easton, but overall, we are happy with Mansfield. || More quiet places for students to study
- Modernize Interior (5): Building could use some modernizing, especially in regards to ventilation and carpeting. Air is very musty in the library. || Facility changes (lighting, furniture, color schemes) that make the building more inviting and less like a cold library. || I recommend that the Mansfield Library upgrade its facilities, e.g., New Carpets, Tables, etc. || The space needs to be updated for the growing population in Mansfield || I'd like to see an updated library space that is even more welcoming to attract a greater visitor flow, with specialized areas that allow for increased community use.
- O New/Expanded Building/Location (5): I feel that the library needs to be physically in a different location from the senior center. | I would also like to see the library building expanded to include a community center that would offer classes in a variety of adult classes from dance, fitness, music, and language. (cont. on next page)

1. Facility Ideas (52/31%) (cont.)

- O New/Expanded Building/Location (5) (cont.): I'd like to see the library given the same treatment as the newer public service buildings. Updating the library building and facilities is a big project, but it ensures the Mansfield library is a place people want to be. My hometown built an entirely new building for its old library, and it was a huge positive force of change for the town. || I would love to see the space the library inhabits physically expand so they are able to do more with more space. || Several neighboring communities have made significant investments in the physical library building. I would love to see Mansfield emulate places like Foxboro and Walpole in making our Library look new and modern.
- Add Reading Space (3): More space to sit and read! || More comfortable areas to read and better area to attend lectures, classes, etc. || Would love some comfy spaces to read
- o **Improve Furniture/Fixtures (3):** A charging station for cell phones and laptops etc. || More, better comfortable seats. The chairs at the right side of the library are not comfortable to sit at the library tables. || More seating to sit and read.
- O **Update Interior Design (3):** Consider a gallery area for small art shows || More colorful and modern look. || I think the display case in the entry could use an update. When you enter a space, you want to be drawn in visually. I understand you're serving the needs of the COA also. The threshold of 2 such engaging enterprises deserves a more enticing... pull, something befitting the sense of possibility, excitement, discovery... enrichment. Empowerment? (You get the idea.)
- Misc. Unique Ideas (7): A spot to listen to music again. No one has been listening to music in the library for years. || Could use a movie theater room. The library doesn't have a place to watch a movie! || Definitely incorporating a makerspace (Lego/magnatile building, coding, robots, steam activities || Have an Internet cafe! Because there's never been any food at the library, and it needs a place to hang out where snacks are allowed.

Unique Ideas (7) (cont.):** Access to the outdoor space behind the library, and some benches or picnic tables would be lovely in the warmer months || Developing an outdoor reading space and/or storytelling area in warmer weather. || In my opinion, it has a modest future as a physical facility given informational technology changes. If and when the Senior Center leaves, I would support re-arranging space for vocational needs, tutoring, study rooms, listening spaces, etc.


